# **MASTER OF PUBLIC POLICY (MPP)**

Our Master of Public Policy (MPP) is an interdisciplinary program that equips students with knowledge of the full impact of science and technology innovations and professional skills in the formulation and implementation of innovative solutions to current and emerging global challenges. Situated in HKUST, a leading university in science and technology, the program draws from research and teaching excellence from across a diverse range of disciplines to equip students with a set of core skills in data analytics, economic analysis and management to become effective policy professionals.

Designed for students with diverse educational backgrounds, including social science, science, engineering, business, and other fields of study, this two-year full-time program consists of a core curriculum, a client-based policy analysis project and elective courses allowing students to develop their areas of specialization. The first of its kind in Hong Kong, this program provides students with complete professional training that focuses on problem-solving skills with real-world cases and examples.

# **CAREER PROSPECTS**

Our program places an emphasis on knowledge, analytical skills and managerial capacities that are highly transferable across sectors, issue areas and global regions. Graduates of the program may work as analysts, managers, researchers and consultants in a wide variety of organizations, including government agencies, non-profit organizations and private sector business. The training provided by the program is particularly relevant for policy professionals in both public and private sectors seeking to advance their careers in industries at the frontline of science and technology advancements, such as information technology and telecommunications, environment, energy, health care, transportation and finance.

The world is facing any number of difficult challenges – from climate change, to the impacts of new technologies, to social inequality. In public policy, we often speak of the "complexity" of these challenges. But complexity is not a barrier; it is the terrain on which society operates. We cannot expect simple solutions in the spaces where systems meet values, where innovation meets equity, and where decisions and trade-offs must be made collaboratively.

At the Division of Public Policy at HKUST, we embrace this terrain. Our work is rooted in the belief that policy is the hard work of improving society, where we are not just responding to problems, but working on shaping our futures. And to build futures for our community and world that are sustainable, inclusive, and resilient, we must engage in dialogue between science, society, and governance.

Our faculty and students are committed to these futures, and to reach our goals, we work across boundaries—disciplinary, sectoral, and geographic. Some of us are modelling climate transitions; others are exploring the governance of AI, or rethinking urban resilience. What unites us is a shared commitment to reflexivity: to questioning assumptions, surfacing values, and engaging with uncertainty rather than avoiding it. We believe that good policy is not only evidence-based, but value-aware.

This Division is a space for joined-up thinking. We draw from engineering, economics, history, sociology, and environmental science to deepen our expertise and reach. Our postgraduate programs in Public Policy and Public Management train future policy leaders to go beyond technical expertise, equipping them with sharp strategic instincts and a deep sense of ethical purpose. We prepare our graduates to lead in systems they understand, and to question systems they seek to improve.

I am optimistic about what lies ahead—not because the challenges are small, but because the capacity for thoughtful, collaborative, and courageous policymaking is immense. If you are curious, critical, and committed to making a difference, I invite you to explore our Division and join the conversation.

# **CURRICULUM**

To graduate, students must complete 48 credit hours, with most courses carrying three credits and involving three hours of weekly lectures. Each semester, students typically enrol in 12 to 15 credits, with approval from the Program Director required for the upper limit. This structure ensures a steady, immersive pace that allows students to absorb core concepts while applying them in collaborative and practical settings.

#### **CORE COURSES (24 CREDITS)**

The required core courses provide students with a grounding of the various perspectives, skills and tools that policy professionals must possess to develop and manage policies effectively.

#### **ELECTIVE COURSES (24 CREDITS)**

Students have the opportunity to enhance their analytical skills through 24 credits of elective courses, which focus on today's most pertinent policy areas and applied analytical methods. While the Division of Public Policy offers a range of elective courses, MPP students may also have the chance to broaden their perspectives by taking courses from other schools/departments/divisions at HKUST. Please note that the availability to take these courses is subject to the approval of the course instructors, the course offering units, and the MPP Program Co-directors. The potential to access a diverse range of electives across the university is one of the unique strengths of the HKUST MPP, setting it apart from programs elsewhere.







# **CROSS-CAMPUS EXCHANGE** WITH HKUST(GZ)

As part of our commitment to interdisciplinary learning and regional collaboration, the Master of Public Policy (MPP) program offers students the opportunity to participate in a cross-campus exchange with the HKUST Guangzhou (HKUST(GZ)) campus. This initiative reflects HKUST's "Unified University, Complementary Campuses" vision-bringing together the strengths of both locations to create a richer, more flexible academic experience.

Beginning in Spring 2026, eligible MPP students will be able to apply to spend their second term at HKUST(GZ), engaging with the MSc in Technology and Policy (MSc TP) program offered by the Innovation, Policy and Entrepreneurship (IPE) Thrust. This exchange is designed to deepen students' understanding of how emerging technologies intersect with public policy, and to foster collaboration across the Greater Bay Area and beyond.





# **CLIENT-BASED POLICY ANALYSIS EXERCISE (PAE)**

The Policy Analysis Project/Exercise (PAE) is the defining capstone of the Master of Public Policy program, challenging students to transform classroom learning into real-world impact. Through client-based consulting and collaborative teamwork, students tackle pressing policy issues with rigor, creativity, and purpose.

The PAE is a year-long, immersive experience where Master of Public Policy students work in small teams under faculty guidance to address real challenges faced by public, private, or non-profit organizations. Anchored in a thematic focus—such as the 2025–26 emphasis on advancing the UN Sustainable Development Goals—students engage in deep research, stakeholder interviews, and policy analys to

deliver actionable recommendations. The process demands critical thinking, professional collaboration, and clear communication, culminating in a client-facing report and formal presentation at the PAE Conference. More than a final project, the PAE serves as a launchpad for careers in policy and public service, embodying the program's commitment to interdisciplinary, applied, and impact-driven education.

## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our program is dedicated to equipping students with the knowledge and skills necessary to excel in their PPOL program and ultimately in the field of public policy. This is achieved through a comprehensive course divided into four main modules:

#### **Orientation and Preparedness**

This module is designed to welcome students to the program and familiarize them with the opportunities and expectations. It includes an introduction to the program, the division, and the faculty, along with workshops on writing and communication basics, library research skills, citation scholarship, and best practices in group work.

#### **Engagement**

This module encourages students to actively participate in talks, lectures, conferences, and symposia. Students are also expected to join outings and field trips. An end-of-year awards ceremony and cocktail party provide opportunities for networking and celebration, as well as incentives to exceed the minimum program requirements.

#### **Career Development**

This module prepares students for their future careers. It includes sessions on interpersonal dynamics, career development workshops, internship programs and opportunities at HKUST, job searching for public policy and project management, resume and cover letter writing workshops, and academic writing workshops. Individual consultation sessions with top professionals are also available throughout the two semesters.

#### Wellness

This module aims to help students adjust (or readjust) to university life by providing advice, materials, and discussions on well-being and growth. Students will learn about stress and time management skills, and personal and professional development planning. By improving self-management skills, such as goal setting and relationship-building, students will be better equipped to succeed.













Starting in the 2021-22 academic year, we introduced the MPP Student Advisory Program. This program assigns a faculty member as an advisor to a small group of students. The aim is to enhance communication between faculty members and students by organizing various enrichment activities and luncheon talks.

Through this program, advisors gain a better understanding of students' study progress and concerns, enabling them to provide targeted advice and support. This helps improve students' academic performance and fosters a deeper connection between advisors and students. Additionally, students can more easily approach a faculty member, ensuring they receive timely advice and assistance. This also encourages students to be more proactive in seeking advice on their academic needs.

Being at HKUST as part of the MPP program is incredibly exciting. I am eager to deepen my understanding, bridge theory with practice, and explore new paths in the field of public policy!



# STUDENT PROFILE

All MPP students admitted to our program have demonstrated excellent academic performance, with many also possessing impressive internship or work experience. While many of our students have graduated from top universities in mainland China, such as Fudan University, Tsinghua University, Peking University, Renmin University of China, Zhejiang University, and Shanghai Jiao Tong University, a wide range of universities and majors are well represented among our MPP students, significantly contributing to the diversity of learning in our program.

We also have students who graduated from well-known overseas universities, such as the University of British Columbia, University of California (Irvine), University College London, and Monash University. Additionally, students from major universities in Hong Kong are well represented in our MPP program.









# **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

#### GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

- · A bachelor's degree with second-class honors from a recognized institution, or an approved equivalent qualification
- · English Language admission requirements set out by the University

Applicants have to fulfil English Language requirements with one of the following proficiency attainments:

Applicants are not required to present TOEFL or IELTS score if

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

- While not required, applicants are encouraged to submit their GMAT/ GRE scores.
- Interests and motivation: Applicants should make a strong case for their interest in pursuing a professional degree in public policy by submitting their statement of purpose about their interests and motivation.
- Favorable consideration will be given to applicants with relevant working experience and (or) internships.
- Selected applicants will be invited to face-to-face interviews or video conferencing/ phone interviews by the admission committee.
